



COMING BACK: Homestead's 1917 Old Town Hall has been restored. Architect Robert Barnes will receive the 1994 Florida Trust for Historic Preservation Award in the nonresidential category for the work. The first floor of Old Town Hall, which once housed a jail and fire department, will become a museum.

■ **Homestead:** Old Town Hall Merit Award. Robert Barnes &

■ **Town of Palm Beach:** Honor Award.

■ **Living History Program** at the Little Red Schoolhouse: Merit Award, Preservation Foundation of Palm Beach.

■ **Seaboard Railway Station:** Honor Award, City of West Palm Beach and Oliver Glidden & Partners, Architects and Planners; also Ralph Hahn & Associates and Keystone Restoration.
